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History of Eureka Resources

July 2008 – Eureka Resources, LLC is founded in Williamsport, Pennsylvania.

November 2008 – Eureka opens its first centralized wastewater treatment plant in Williamsport to serve E&P companies that have begun hydrofracturing operations in the Marcellus Shale in Pennsylvania.

January 2009 – Eureka Resources continues to grow as more natural gas companies seek centrally-located, turnkey solutions to meet their wastewater management needs. Company secures exclusive long-term vendor agreements and submits numerous technology patents.

June 2010 – Williamsport Plant 1 expansion doubles treatment capacity and Eureka becomes the first treatment facility in the Marcellus Shale to use Mechanical Vapor Recompression (MVR) technology. Eureka's process allows for recovery of as much as 95 percent distilled water from gas well wastewater.

January 2011 – Plant operates 24 hours a day, seven days a week, successfully treating frac water, flowback water, produced water, and muds. Distillation through MVR continues, and customers realize reduced hauling and disposal costs.

June 2011 – Capital investment increases plant operating efficiencies and technologies that benefit customers who want automated manifesting and web-enabled customer access to their utilization records.

January 2012 – Based on expanding drilling operations, new sites are selected, purchased and permitted for additional wastewater treatment plants to serve E&P companies in other areas of the Marcellus Shale.

March 2013 – Construction begins on Standing Stone Plant as Williamsport 1 processes as much as 420,000 gallons of wastewater per day. The Standing Stone plant will double processing capacity.

May 2013 – Construction begins on the third Eureka facility in Williamsport's Industrial Park at Reach Road. This facility will be constructed in two phases with the first phase including bulk treatment and storage services to be operational in October 2013.

October 2013 – Standing Stone Plant Phase 1 scheduled to come on line, with a second phase of expansion planned to add sophisticated crystallization and ultrafiltration technologies.

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
